

MEN – #1 Dave Palm / Roberto Rodriguez – AVP Atlantic City Open – July 22-24, 2022

- Duo is playing together for the 6th time on the AVP Tour (all this season) with two wins (Muskegon and Waupaca)
- In an AVP Next event in Panama City, Fla., Palm and Mark Burik finished 3rd, qualifying them for a main draw spot in the season opener in Austin... just prior to that event Burik got injured and Rodriguez was his replacement... Burik is back to action now but Palm and Rodriguez have stuck together
- On the Pro Series the duo is 0-4 in matches, but on the Tour Series the pair is 13-2 in matches
- When they won in Muskegon their last 4 matches all came against teams seeded 4th or better
- Entering Atlantic City, in 1 season as partners on the AVP, they are 13-6 (68.4%) in matches, 11-1 (91.7%) when winning the first set, 2-5 (28.6%) when losing the first set, and 5-1 (83.3%) in three-set matches... they lost their first three-set match but since then have won 5 consecutive

Dave Palm – age 31 – 6'4" – hometown Hialeah, Fla. – currently Coral Springs, Fla.

- Atlantic City is the 15th AVP event Palm has ever played in with 2 wins (Muskegon 2022 and Wuapaca 2022)
- He is one of 6 men's players who are playing in their 6th AVP event of the year (the most possible as two tournaments overlapped), along with Roberto Rodriguez, Logan Webber, Avery Drost, Silila Tucker and Lev Priima
- He has played 5 times with Rodriguez (including Denver), while the other 9 AVP tournaments have been with 8 different partners
- Palm got his 1st career AVP win in Muskegon and he had 7 blocks in the championship match... his 2nd career win came in Wuapaca and he had 12 blocks in the championship match
- Palm is fluent in sign language

Roberto Rodriguez – age 35 – 6'3" – hometown Guaynabo, P.R. – currently New Smyrna Beach, Fla.

- Atlantic City is the 39th AVP event Palm has ever played in
- He is one of 6 men's players who are playing in their 6th AVP event of the year (the most possible as two tournaments overlapped), along with Dave Palm, Logan Webber, Avery Drost, Silila Tucker and Lev Priima
- Rodriguez won in San Francisco 2018 with Ed Ratledge, then got his 2nd win in Muskegon and his 3rd in Wuapaca (both with Palm)
- Along with partner Kevin McColloch, became the first team seeded #16 to win a first-round match against a #1 seed on the AVP Tour, accomplishing the feat in Seattle in 2016. Previously #1 seeds had been 23-0 against #16 seeds in first round matches.
- Rodriguez did not advance from the qualifier in his first 5 AVP events of his career, then after doing so in his 6th, his first AVP main draw match was against 2016 Olympians Jake Gibb and Casey Patterson and Rodriguez won
- Since reaching his first main draw he has had just 2 AVP events where he lost in the qualifier (both in 2017) and both times it was against a pair of players who have been Olympians (either indoors or beach)

MEN – #2 Seain Cook / Logan Webber – AVP Atlantic City Open – July 22-24, 2022

- Duo is playing together for the 3rd time on the AVP Tour
- They finished 5th in Muskegon with all four matches being extended... they won twice in sweeps, including against the 5th-seeded team, but with set scores of 23-21 in their first match and 31-29 in their second match... both of their losses came in three-set matches after winning the first set
- In Denver they placed third, with both of their losses coming to 4th-seeded Evan Cory / Billy Kolinske (and both in three sets)... they won three straight contender's bracket matches to reach the semifinals (two of those wins were three-set matches), and defeated both 2nd-seeded Billy Allen / Jeremy Casebeer and 7th-seeded Dave Palm / Roberto Rodriguez

Seain Cook – age 30 – 6'4" – hometown Perth, Scotland – currently Hermosa Beach, Calif. – University of Bath

- Atlantic City is the 6th AVP tournament ever for Cook, who has a best of 3rd in Denver 2022
- In his AVP debut in Manhattan Beach 2019, he was eliminated in the qualifier by Max Martin. He then teamed up with Martin in Wuapaca 2022 and finished 17th
- Cook's father, Iain, played indoor volleyball for Scotland
- Cook played on the Scottish National Team for 10 years and was an alternate for Team Great Britain in the 2012 London Olympics
- He was part of the first Scottish beach volleyball team to ever qualify for the Commonwealth Games, and he also played professionally indoors in The Netherlands and France
- Cook married Courtney Kidd-Kadlubek, who played volleyball at Sacred Heart University and was the conference Player of the Year and a two-time conference Setter of the Year, ranking seventh nationally in assists per game in Division I as a senior. He and his wife had a baby boy, Caoimhe, in May 2022

Logan Webber – age 26 – 6'7" – hometown Grand Rapids, Mich. – currently Grand Rapids, Mich. – Cincinnati Christian

- Webber is playing in his 22nd AVP Tournament with 9 different partners
- He is one of 6 men's players who are playing in their 6th AVP event of the year (the most possible as two tournaments overlapped), along with Dave Palm, Roberto Rodriguez, Avery Drost, Silila Tucker and Lev Prima
- Webber's first semifinal came in Denver as he and Seain Cook placed third
- This year Webber played two international events with Miles Evans, and they went from the qualifier to claiming a silver medal in Rhodes, Greece in May
- This season Webber is second on the Tour in kills (7.85 per set in Pro Series events)
- In May 2018, he missed his final week of college to play in an FIVB event in Huntington Beach, advancing through the country quota and qualifier to reach the main draw, placing 33rd with David Vander Meer
- In Austin 2022 Webber and John Hyden broke the AVP record for having the biggest age discrepancy between partners in a main draw (23 years, 0 months and 22 days difference in age)
- Webber has an older sister, Libby, who played volleyball at Cornerstone University in Grand Rapids, Michigan
- Webber was an assistant coach for the women's volleyball team at Cincinnati Christian and assistant coach for the men's volleyball team at Cornerstone University
