

WOMEN – #1 Larissa Maestrini / Lili Maestrini – AVP Atlantic City Open – July 22-24, 2022

- Duo is playing together for the 9th time on the AVP Tour
- They failed to advance from the qualifier in their debut in Atlanta 2021, but since then have been in the semifinals in 4 tournaments, with a win in both Muskegon and Denver (the last two Tour Series events)
- Entering Atlantic City, in 2 seasons as partners on the AVP (including qualifiers), they are 32-12 (72.7%) in matches, 24-1 (96%) when winning the first set, 8-11 (42.1%) when losing the first set, and 12-3 (80%) in three-set matches
- On the Tour Series, the duo is 10-1 in matches with two titles

Larissa Maestrini – age 40 – 5'9" – hometown Cachoeiro de Itapemirim-Es, Brazil – currently Celebration, Fla.

- All-time leader in FIVB wins (62)... she won 8 times in Brazil (in 19 international events) while winning 8 times in Poland (in 9 tournaments)
- 3-time Olympian (2008, 2012, 2016), winning a bronze in 2012 with Juliana Felisberta
- Has won 3 times on the AVP Tour... won in Glendale, Arizona in 2009 with Juliana Felisberta, then won in Muskegon and Denver this year with Lili
- Larissa has had success in the United States even when competing on the FIVB Tour... in her 6 FIVB events held in America, she won 3 times (twice in Fort Lauderdale and once in Long Beach)
- She won her first title in July 2004, and since then has had just 1 year in which she played but did not win at least one event, as her best finish in her 3 AVP tournaments in 2021 was a 2nd place (did not play at all in 2013, 2018, 2019 and 2020 but won in all other seasons)
- Larissa is one of 5 women who are playing for the 6th time this season on the AVP Tour (the most possible as two tournaments overlapped), along with Lili Maestrini, Karolina Marciniak, Megan Rice and Katie Spieler

Lili Maestrini – age 34 – 6'0" – hometown Vitoria, Brazil – currently Celebration, Fla.

- This is just the 9th AVP event ever for Lili, who has played alongside Larissa in all 9
- Lili won 2 FIVB titles, both in 2018 and both with Josemari Alves
- Lili has been in the semifinals in 4 of her 8 AVP events, with 2 wins
- Lili is one of 5 women who are playing for the 6th time this season on the AVP Tour (the most possible as two tournaments overlapped), along with Larissa Maestrini, Karolina Marciniak, Megan Rice and Katie Spieler

WOMEN – #2 Delaney Mewhirter / Kelly Reeves – AVP Atlantic City Open – July 22-24, 2022

- Duo is playing together for the 3rd time on the AVP Tour, having improved from 13th in Denver to 9th in Hermosa Beach
- In Reeve's only season of beach volleyball at UCLA (2013), the Bruins played against Mewhirter's Pepperdine team twice but the two never faced each other as Reeves was on the number one court and Mewhirter on court three
- In the Hermosa Beach 2022 9th place match, the pair took 6th-seeded Emily Day / Savvy Simo to a third set where they had four match points but ended up losing 19-17

Delaney Knudsen Mewhirter – age 26 – 5'10" – hometown Valencia, Calif. – currently Hermosa Beach, Calif. – Pepperdine

- Mewhirter is playing in her 40th career AVP tournament with her 16th different partner
- Her best finish came with Katie Spieler, a 7th-place finish in Manhattan Beach in 2019)... she also has 5 9th-place finishes
- Her first AVP main draw match ever was in Manhattan Beach 2014, where she (and Katie Spieler) had to face April Ross and Kerri Walsh Jennings
- Mewhirter won the AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball National Team Championship in 2014 as a freshman with Caitlin Racich
- Both of her parents played volleyball in college, as her father Mark played at UCLA and her mother Diane played at Long Beach City College. She has three younger siblings, including sister Lindsey who played at St. Mary's as well as on the AVP Tour.
- She married fellow AVP player Travis Mewhirter, who is playing in this tournament

Kelly Reeves – age 30 – 6'0" – hometown San Diego, Calif. – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – UCLA

- Reeves is playing in her 38th AVP Tournament, with 4 3rd-place finishes (last done in Manhattan Beach 2019 with Terese Cannon)
- This marks Reeves' 11th different partner on the AVP Tour, and she has been in the semifinals with 3 different ones
- Reeves played 5 FIVB events in 2021, losing in the country quota each time
- Reeves' first ever pro beach volleyball event was a 2016 NORCECA event in Guatemala, which she won alongside Ali McColloch
- Reeves was an outside hitter at UCLA, where she was named First Team All-PAC-12 in 2011 when she led the team to a National Championship. When she left the school she was ninth all-time in digs with 1,186. In 2013 she also played sand volleyball for UCLA, and was selected as the school's first ever AVCA Collegiate Sand Volleyball All-American
- Reeves was born in the UCLA hospital, her mother Jeanne played at UCLA, and she has an aunt, grandfather and cousin who all attended UCLA
- Her mother Jeanne was an All-American UCLA, ranking 14th in career kills, won a silver medal in the 1984 Olympics, and was an assistant coach on the Bruins' 1990 and 1991 National Championship teams

WOMEN – #3 Katie Dickens / Jennifer Keddy – AVP Atlantic City Open – July 22-24, 2022

- Duo is playing together for the 6th time on the AVP Tour
- The players went to schools on opposite sides of the country but now both live in Austin
- Both players played in their first AVP championship match in Wuapaca (previous best was 7th for both players)
- Entering Atlantic City, in 2 seasons as partners on the AVP (including qualifiers), they are 13-8 (61.9%) in matches, 10-2 (83.3%) when winning the first set, 2-6 (25%) when losing the first set, and 4-3 (57.1%) in three-set matches

Katie Dickens – age 28 – 5’11” – hometown Covington, La. – currently Austin, Texas – Louisiana State

- Atlantic City is the 20th AVP tournament in her career and will be her 7th AVP main draw she has ever played in
- Dickens played in Muskegon with Maria Kliefoth (finished 13th), her only partner besides Keddy since the start of 2021
- She was part of a play-by-play announcer’s nightmare team in 2019, playing three AVP events alongside Lauren Dickson
- In Dickens’ first ever AVP main draw match (in Austin 2019 with Dickson), she upset top-seeded Emily Day / Betsi Flint
- Dickens played four seasons on LSU's indoor volleyball team, then also played four years on the beach volleyball team
- She was on the inaugural beach team at LSU, which advanced to the NCAA Championships her senior year
- Her mother, Melissa, played volleyball at both New Orleans and Southwestern Louisiana. She has an older brother, Blake, and an older sister, Rachel, who played volleyball at Tulane
- Dickens was the 2010 Gatorade Player of the Year in Louisiana

Jennifer Keddy – age 30 – 6’4” – hometown Missoula, Mont. – currently Austin, Texas – Cal Poly San Luis Obispo

- Atlantic City is just the 6th AVP event ever for Keddy, who has played alongside Dickens in all 6
- Keddy played four years of indoor volleyball at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo. She was AVCA Third Team All-American her sophomore season and Honorable Mention her junior year
- Keddy was the 2011 Big West Conference Player of the Year
- When she left the school she was fifth in career hitting percentage (.319) and her 2011 average of 4.06 kills per set ranked as the sixth best in program history
- Keddy has six siblings, three brothers and three sisters
