- In their first 8 AVP semifinals, the duo went undefeated in reaching the semifinals... this marks the 3rd straight time they had to come through the contender's bracket to reach the semis (Chicago 2018, Huntington Beach 2019 and now Austin)
- Became just the 3rd team seeded #1 to lose in the first round to a #16 seed (others were Seattle 2016 and New York 2017)

Taylor Crabb - age 27 - 6'0" - hometown Honolulu - currently Redondo Beach, Calif. - Long Beach State

- This is Crabb's 30th AVP event, and he has won 5 AVP titles (all with Gibb) ... He is 0-4 in finals with partners other than Gibb
- Crabb has reached the semifinals in 20 of his previous 23 AVP tournaments
- Crabb reached the championship match in his only previous event in Austin (2018 with Tim Bomgren)

Jake Gibb – age 43 – 6'7" – hometown Bountiful, Utah – currently Huntington Beach, Calif. – Utah

- Gibb is playing in his 155th AVP Tournament, with 31 AVP wins (plus 6 FIVB wins)... Gibb has won at least
 one title with 5 different partners... He has won multiple AVP titles in each of the last 6 seasons, and is the
 only player who can make that claim
- Gibb has advanced to the title match in all 3 of his trips to Austin (getting his first career win in 2004 and finishing 2nd in 2005)
- Gibb is 31-30 in AVP championship matches (13-3 with Casey Patterson, 8-19 with Sean Rosenthal, 4-2 with Stein Metzger, 5-2 with Taylor Crabb, 1-1 with Adam Jewell and 0-3 in individual events)

- Jeremy Casebeer / Chaim Schalk have yet to lose a set in Austin (8-0)... no team has won an AVP title without dropping a single set since Austin in 2018, when Phil Dalhausser / Nick Lucena went 10-0 in sets

Jeremy Casebeer - age 30 - 6'5" - hometown Santa Barbara, Calif. - currently Santa Barbara, Calif. - UCLA

- This is Casebeer's 46th AVP event, and he has a best of 2nd (New York 2016 with Sean Rosenthal)
- In 2018 Casebeer and his partner Reid Priddy were 2 of just 8 players to reach at least 4 semifinals

<u>Chaim Schalk – age 33 – 6'5" – hometown Red Deer, Alberta, Canada – currently Gardena, Calif. – Trinity Western</u> / Red Deer College

Schalk is playing in his 14th AVP Tournament, with a best of 2nd (Chicago 2018 with Tim Bomgren)

General AVP Championship Notes

- 16 of the last 18 AVP championships have been won by the team winning the first set... the 2 exceptions were both in Manhattan Beach (2017 and 2018)
- The higher (better) seeded team has won each of the last 5 AVP title matches
- From 2001 through Huntington Beach (when we had match results so can tell if a team came through contender's or not), of the 168 men's titles, 43 of the winning teams came through contender's (125 through winner's), including each of the last 3 and 4 of the past 5 tournaments.
- In the season opening tournament in Huntington Beach, Jake Gibb joined Karch Kiraly and John Hyden as the only players to ever win an AVP title at the age of 43 or older... From the Cincinnati event in September 2015 through Austin, there have been 27 AVP events and 13 of the men's titles have been won by a player age 40 or older... In those 27 championship matches, at least one player has been over the age of 40 a total of 19 times... Gibb is the only Austin semifinalist who is over 40 years old
- Beginning with Austin 2018, 5 of the last 9 AVP titles have gone to the team seeded #1 in the event... in that span the #1 seed is 5-1 in championship matches
