- Duo is playing together for the 51st time on the AVP Tour and for the 95th time overall... The pair has won 12 AVP titles, including last year in Hawai'i
- Since reuniting in 2015, they have been in the finals of 15 of the 23 AVP events, winning 11 times... Of the 6 events in which they did not play in the championship, they have forfeited 3 times (Huntington Beach 2016, Manhattan Beach 2016, New York 2017)... Last season the pair had a 26-4 match record on the AVP while in 2019 they are 18-5... in Huntington Beach to open the season the pair lost consecutive matches in the same AVP event for the first time since reuniting in 2015 (other than consecutive forfeits)
- Last year in Honolulu the duo lost their first match then swept four straight opponents to win the title

Phil Dalhausser – age 39 – 6'9" – hometown Baden, Switzerland – currently Manhattan Beach, Calif. – Central Florida

- Married to Jennifer Coral, who played at Ventura College and Tennessee State and some AVP... The couple has two children (Sebastian and Sofia)
- This is Dalhausser's 139th AVP event, and he has won 57 AVP titles (plus 38 FIVB wins) ... of his 7 career AVP partners, 4 have played in the Olympics (and has played just 3 AVP events with a player who has not been in the Olympics)
- Since winning in Austin in 2005, Dalhausser has won at least one title (AVP or FIVB) in each of the past 15 seasons (including 2019)
- Dalhausser is a three-time Olympian (Gold in 2008 with Todd Rogers, 9th in 2012 with Rogers, 5th in 2016 with Lucena)

Nick Lucena – age 39 – 6'1" – hometown Davie, Fla. – currently Tallahassee, Fla. – Florida State

- Married to Brooke Niles, who played at Cal-Santa Barbara and on AVP Tour (won in Huntington Beach in 2011)... Niles coaches beach volleyball at Florida State... They have two sons (Gunnar and Cole)
- Lucena is playing in his 142nd AVP Tournament, with 14 wins (plus 9 FIVB wins)... When playing AVP with other players, Lucena won 2 titles in 91 events (2-14 in finals)
- Lucena has the second longest streak of reaching the semifinals (having done so at least once each year since 2007)
- Lucena was a 2016 Olympian (5th in 2016 with Dalhausser)

- Duo is playing together for the 18th time on the AVP Tour and for the 43rd time overall... The pair has won 7 AVP titles, including a tour-most three times this season (Huntington Beach, Austin, Chicago)
- This year the duo is 24-6 on the AVP... Last season the pair had a 23-6 match record on the AVP, with 3 of the match losses coming against teams seeded 1st... In 2018 the duo played in 4 championship matches... in Austin 2019 became just 2nd men's team ever to lose first match and come back to win event
- Last year the duo placed fifth in Hawai'i... that marked the only time in their 12 events together since the start of 2018 in which the pair did not make the semifinals
- The pair is coming off a fourth-place finish in the FIVB World Tour Finals in Rome, which earned them their most points during the Olympic qualification period thus far

Taylor Crabb – age 27 – 6'0" – hometown Honolulu – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – Long Beach State

- Has an older brother Trevor, who also plays on the AVP Tour... The brothers were partners for 12 AVP events (best of 3rd 3 times) and 5 FIVB events (best of 9th 4 times) ... Taylor leads the head-to-head matchup 6-3, winning the last 3 meetings between the Crabbs
- This is Crabb's 34th AVP event, and he has won 7 AVP titles (all with Gibb) ... He is 0-4 in finals with partners other than Gibb
- Entering Honolulu, Crabb has reached the semifinals in 23 of his previous 26 AVP tournaments
- Crabb has been part of the highest ranked AVP team in 2 of the last 3 seasons (2016 with brother Trevor Crabb and 2018 with Gibb)
- Since Crabb began playing full time on the AVP Tour (2015), he has led the Tour in digs per set three times and finished second once (2018)

Jake Gibb – age 43 – 6'7" – hometown Bountiful, Utah – currently Huntington Beach, Calif. – Utah

- Married to Jane, who played in 5 qualifiers on the AVP in 2007... they have two kids (Crosby and Cora Jane)
- Gibb is playing in his 159th AVP Tournament, with 33 AVP wins (plus 6 FIVB wins)... Gibb has won with 5 different partners... He is the only player who has won multiple AVP titles in each of the last 7 seasons (including 2019)
- Gibb is a three-time Olympian (5th in 2008 with Sean Rosenthal, 5th in 2012 with Rosenthal, and 19th in 2016 with Casey Patterson)
- In each of the last 4 seasons, Gibb has finished ranked in the top 4 in blocks per set each time

- Duo is playing together for the 7th time on the AVP Tour and for the 17th time overall... their 6 AVP tournaments have yielded 5 semifinal appearances (2nd, then 5th, then 3rd, then 1st, then 2nd, then 3rd)
- Last year these two players faced off against each other twice, with Budinger winning both times (New York and San Francisco)
- Entering Honolulu the duo has a 23-7 match record on the AVP Tour... 6 of their 7 match losses this season have come to one of the Crabb brothers
- The team's 3 championship appearances in 2019 is the second most on the AVP Tour, behind only Taylor Crabb / Jake Gibb (4 title appearances)
- Neither player has competed in Hawai'i previously

Chase Budinger – age 31 – 6'7" – hometown Encinitas, Calif. – currently Hermosa Beach, Calif. – Arizona

- Budinger has an older brother, Duncan, who also plays on the AVP Tour... The brothers have played against each other twice, in the 2018 Manhattan Beach Open, when Chase defeated Duncan 17-15 in the third set, then in Seattle when Chase won in a sweep
- In high school Budinger was rated the No. 4 basketball player and the National Volleyball Player of the Year
- Budinger played basketball at Arizona, then played seven seasons in the NBA with four different teams... He competed in the 2012 NBA Slam Dunk Contest
- Budinger is playing in his 13th AVP tournament, with 1 win (Hermosa Beach 2019 with Casey Patterson) and has finished 2nd 3 times (San Francisco 2018 with Sean Rosenthal, Huntington Beach 2018 with Casey Patterson, and Manhattan Beach 2019 with Casey Patterson)

Casey Patterson – age 39 – 6'6" – hometown Manhattan Beach, Calif. – currently Camarillo, Calif. – Arizona

- Patterson is married to Lexi ... They have two sons (Cash and Guy) and one daughter (Ray)
- Patterson is playing in his 99th AVP Tournament, with 15 wins (13 with Jake Gibb, 1 with Ty Loomis and 1 with Chase Budinger)... He also has 2 FIVB wins (both with Jake Gibb)
- Patterson has advanced to at least one AVP semifinal in each of the past 7 years (from 2013 and including 2019)... He has a 15-5 record in AVP finals and has also finished 3rd 14 times
- In each of the 4 years from 2013 to 2016, Patterson had the most wins of any individual on the AVP Tour (along with Jake Gibb... In that span, he advanced to the semifinals in 23 of his 26 AVP tournaments)
- Patterson was a 2016 Olympian, finishing 19th with Jake Gibb

- Duo is playing together for the 8th time on the AVP Tour and for the 8th time overall... duo collected the first ever victories for both players by winning the title in Seattle, but then fell down to a 13th place finish in Hermosa Beach
- In the past 2 years these two players faced off against each other 5 times, with Schalk eliminating Casebeer from 3 tournaments while Schalk got past Casebeer in the semifinals in Chicago 2018 to reach his first AVP championship
- The duo has a 21-11 match record in 2019 entering Honolulu... they were 9-1 in Austin and Seattle and 12-10 in the other 5 events this season

Jeremy Casebeer – age 30 – 6’5” – hometown Santa Barbara, Calif. – currently Santa Barbara, Calif. – UCLA

- Casebeer is married to fellow pro beach volleyball player Maria Clara Salgado from Brazil, who won two FIVB gold medals with her sister Carolina Salgado... They have one son (Joaquim)
- This is Casebeer’s 52nd AVP event, and he has 1 win (Seattle 2019 with Chaim Schalk) and placed 2nd twice (New York 2016 with Sean Rosenthal and Austin 2019 with Chaim Schalk)
- In Hermosa Beach 2018, Casebeer teamed with Olympic Gold Medalist Eric Fonoimoana (finished 15th), and their first round match meant that Fonoimoana became the oldest men’s player to ever win a main draw match (49 years, 1 month, 20 days), bettering Karch Kiraly’s mark by almost 2 ½ years
- Casebeer had 26 aces in the first 3 events of 2019 (13 matches), then had 25 in Seattle (5 matches)... on the year he has 92 aces, which is nearly as much as the next two players combined (101)
- Last year in Honolulu Casebeer finished 7th alongside Reid Priddy

Chaim Schalk – age 33 – 6’5” – hometown Red Deer, Alberta, Canada – currently Gardena, Calif. – Trinity Western / Red Deer College

- Schalk is married to fellow pro beach volleyball player Lane Carico, and they have a newborn daughter (Koa)
- Schalk is playing in his 20th AVP Tournament, with 1 win (Seattle 2019 with Jeremy Casebeer) and has placed 2nd twice (Chicago 2018 with Tim Bomgren and Austin 2018 with Jeremy Casebeer)
- In the last open event of 2018, in Chicago, Schalk and Tim Bomgren had to play each of the top four seeds (defeated #1 and #3, lost to #2 and #4)
- Schalk played on the FIVB Tour from 2010-2017, primarily with Ben Saxton, winning a silver and three bronze medals
- In New York 2017, Schalk played with Ricardo Santos and advanced to his first ever AVP main draw... in his first main draw match he defeated top-seeded Phil Dalhausser / Nick Lucena en route a 3rd-place finish

- Duo is playing together for the 7th time on the AVP Tour and for the 7th time overall, and has reached the semifinals in 3 of the previous 6 events
- Last year these two players faced off against each other just one time, in Hermosa Beach... Bomgren won that match after winning first set then Field / Chase Frishman had to forfeit at the technical timeout of the second set
- Entering Honolulu the duo has a 22-14 match record, and has lost its last 4 matches
- In the first 3 tournaments of the year, the duo had a 13-6 match record, but in the last 4 outings they have compiled a 9-8 match mark
- Neither player has competed in Hawai'i previously

Tim Bomgren – age 32 – 6'4" – hometown Woodbury, Minn. – currently Golden Valley, Minn. – Wisconsin-Eau Claire

- Bomgren has a younger brother, Brian, who also plays on the AVP Tour... The brothers were partners for 28 AVP events from 2013-17, with their best finish in the 2015 season opener in New Orleans (3rd place after winning three qualifier matches)
- Bomgren is married to Lindsey, who played volleyball collegiately... They have a son (Brody)
- Bomgren is playing in his 44th AVP tournament, with a best of 2nd three times (Austin 2018 with Taylor Crabb, Chicago 2018 with Chaim Schalk, and New York City 2019 with Troy Field)
- Bomgren advanced to 1 AVP semifinal in his first 29 AVP tournaments (28 of those came alongside younger brother Brian), then since the start of 2018 he played in 6 AVP semifinals in his 14 events with 4 different partners

Troy Field – age 25 – 6'4" – hometown Laguna Beach, Calif. – currently Mission Viejo, Calif. – Saddleback Community College

- Field is playing in his 17th AVP Tournament, with a best of 3rd in his first two 2019 events (Huntington Beach and Austin) before placing 2nd in New York City... prior to that his best was 9th 3 times
- All 7 of Field's 2019 finishes have ranked in the top 7 of his career
- In 2017-18 Field had won 7 main draw matches, and 5 of them came against teams that advanced from the qualifier... The other 2 wins came versus the #10 seed in Austin and #18 seed in Manhattan Beach... then in the first five events of 2019 he chalked up 22 wins, including 5 wins over top 4 seeds
- Last year Field advanced from the qualifier in the season opener, was eliminated in the qualifier in the next 3 tournaments, then was seeded directly into the main draw for the last 3 events

- The duo is playing their 5th AVP event together and 5th overall event... they have 2 semifinal appearances together
- The pair has reunited after last playing together in the final 4 events of the 2017 season

Reid Priddy – age 41 – 6’4” – hometown Richmond, Va. – currently Huntington Beach, Calif. – Loyola Marymount

- Priddy is married to Lindsay, who played volleyball in high school and was a former national champion in horse reining... They have two children (Caden and Eden Scarlett)
- Following his senior season at Loyola Marymount, when he was selected as the school’s Male Athlete of the Year, the school dropped the men’s volleyball program
- Priddy is playing in his 47th AVP Tournament, with 1 win (Manhattan Beach 2019 with Trevor Crabb) to go with 3rd 6 times... Priddy did not participate in any AVP events between 2010 and 2016... He has had 16 different partners on the AVP Tour
- With his victory in Manhattan Beach, Priddy became the 6th different individual to win an AVP title after the age of 40, joining Karch Kiraly, Mike Whitmarsh, John Hyden, Jake Gibb and Ed Ratledge
- Priddy did not reach the semifinals in his first 31 AVP tournaments, but has now done so in 7 of his last 15 AVP events
- Priddy is one of just two players (along with Lloy Ball) in U.S. history to compete in four Olympics in men’s indoor volleyball... After serving as an alternate in 2000, Priddy represented the U.S. in 2004 (4th place), 2008 (won gold), 2012 (5th place), and 2016 (bronze medal after recovering from a torn ACL in May 2014)
- Priddy currently has the 3rd most aces on the AVP Tour (47)
- Priddy and Jeremy Casebeer finished 7th in Honolulu last year

Ricardo Santos – age 44 – 6’7” – hometown Salvador, Brazil – currently Orlando, Fla.

- Ricardo is married (Luciana), and they have 3 kids (Pedro, who lives in Brazil and plays on the national beach volleyball tour, Giulia, and Nicolas)
- Ricardo is playing in his 16th AVP Tournament, with a best of 3rd 5 times (Glendale 2009 with Emanuel, New York 2017 with Chaim Schalk, San Francisco 2017 with Reid Priddy, 2017 Manhattan Beach with Priddy, and 2019 New York City with Sean Rosenthal)
- On the FIVB Tour, Ricardo has played in 237 events, winning 55 gold medals (2nd most all-time), 31 silvers, and 23 bronzes... his 33 golds with Emanuel are the most ever by any men’s team
- Last event Ricardo played with Ty Loomis, marking the first time on the AVP that he has played with a partner who was not an Olympian (Emanuel, Rosenthal and Schalk in beach volleyball, Priddy in indoor volleyball)

- Duo is playing together for the 4th time on the AVP Tour and the 4th time overall
- These two players have met 4 times on 3 different tours... Doherty won the only AVP meeting in Huntington Beach 2016, and won both FIVB meetings in 2018... the last meeting came in September 2018 on p1440, when Evans claimed the win
- Entering Honolulu the duo has an 9-6 match record on the AVP Tour... all 6 of their losses have come against teams seeded 4th or better
- Neither player has competed in Hawai'i previously

Ryan Doherty – age 35 – 7'1" – hometown Toms River, N.J. – currently Hermosa Beach, Calif. – Notre Dame

- After being an All-American pitcher at Notre Dame, Doherty became the tallest pitcher in minor league history
- This is Doherty's 50th AVP event, and he has 3 wins (in Seattle 2015 with John Mayer, in New Orleans 2016 with John Mayer, and in Chicago 2017 with John Hyden)
- Doherty has played with 11 different partners in his AVP career including Evans... He has reached the title match with each of the 6 players he has competed with in at least 3 tournaments
- Doherty played the 2018 season with Billy Allen, getting one 2nd and two 3rds in their 7 AVP events
- This season Doherty and John Hyden placed 9th in New York City and 7th in Seattle before teaming up with Evans

Miles Evans – age 29 – 6'4" – hometown Santa Barbara, Calif. – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – Santa Barbara City College

- Evans is playing in his 12th AVP Tournament, and he has played with 8 different partners
- Evans' first AVP main draw was in Huntington Beach 2016 with Curt Toppel... the duo advanced from the qualifier, then Evans' first AVP main draw match came against Ryan Doherty (lost)... he did rebound to win against a couple of Olympic Gold medalists, defeating Phil Dalhausser (by forfeit) as well as Todd Rogers (in three sets), finishing in 5th place
- In Hermosa Beach 2019 Evans got his career best AVP finish, as he and Ryan Doherty reached the title match in what was their first event together... the pair knocked off the tournament's top seeds but lost twice to the third seeds
- Honolulu marks the 4th straight AVP tournament that Evans has been in the main draw... he began the 2019 season with a pair of qualification tournaments, playing with Marty Lorenz in New York City and Avery Drost in Seattle)
- Evans and Billy Kolinske have played 24 FIVB tournaments together, including 8 this season

- Duo is playing together for the 5th time on the AVP Tour and for the 18th time overall
- On the AVP Tour the duo has a best of 3rd twice (Honolulu 2018 and Huntington Beach 2019)
- On the FIVB Tour the pair won a gold medal in China in October (part of the 2019 season) in a three-star event
- Last season the duo had a 10-5 match record on the AVP Tour... They were especially strong in three-set matches, going 6-1 in third sets... In 2019 the duo has a 5-3 match record entering Honolulu
- The duo has played Taylor Crabb / Jake Gibb 3 times this season (when they were ranked #1 each time), going 1-2 against them
- Before teaming up, these two players faced each other 9 times (Bourne went 8-0 on the AVP Tour while Crabb's lone win came on the FIVB Tour)
- Last year the pair finished 3rd in Honolulu

Tri Bourne – age 30 – 6'5" – hometown Honolulu, Hawai'i – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – Southern California

- Bourne turned 30 on Sunday... The youngest of four kids, Bourne's parents are both triathletes, hence his name
- Bourne is playing in his 27th AVP tournament, with 3 victories (Milwaukee 2014, Cincinnati 2015, and Huntington Beach 2015, all with John Hyden)
- In his career, Bourne has advanced to the semifinals in 18 of his 26 AVP tournaments, including 9 championship match appearances
- In 5 of his last 6 AVP tournaments alongside John Hyden, Bourne played for the AVP title (3 times in 2015, 2 in 2016, but then placed 3rd in the 2019 season opener in Huntington Beach)

Trevor Crabb – age 30 – 6'4" – hometown Honolulu, Hawai'i – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – Puget Sound / Long Beach State

- Has a younger brother Taylor, who also plays on the AVP Tour... The brothers were partners for 12 AVP events (best of 3rd 3 times) and 5 FIVB events (best of 9th 4 times)... Taylor leads the head-to-head matchup 6-3, winning the last 3 meetings between the Crabbs
- Crabb is playing in his 43rd AVP Tournament, with 1 win (Manhattan Beach 2019 with Reid Priddy) and has placed 2nd 7 times (4 with Sean Rosenthal and 3 with Taylor Crabb)... He also has 3 FIVB wins (winning a three-star and a two-star in 2018 with John Mayer, then winning a three-star with Tri Bourne in October 2018)
- Crabb has been in the semifinals on the AVP Tour just 3 times in his last 12 outings... Prior to that stretch he had advanced to the semifinals in 13 of 14 AVP tournaments

- In his AVP career Allen advanced to 5 semifinals in his first 88 tournaments, but since has been in 9 semifinals in his last 19 events entering Honolulu

- Slick is married to Julie Motz, a former middle blocker at Michigan Tech who set the school season record for blocks and left with 3rd best career hitting percentage... They have a son (Edison) and a daughter (Delaney)
- Slick is playing in his 49th AVP Tournament, with 1 win (Seattle 2017 with Billy Allen)
- Slick has advanced to at least one AVP semifinal in each of the past 6 years (from 2013 through 2018)... 8 of his 12 career AVP semifinals have come since suffering a partially detached retina in his left eye in the 2016 season opener in New Orleans
