FUN FACT: Jokic had 3 straight triple-doubles from 2/13-23/18 and has had 2 in a row 7 times (last on 4/9-11/2021)

FUN FACT: Denver won first 17 home games when Jokic had a triple-double

FUN FACT: On 10/29/19 vs DAL, had the 8th triple-double in NBA history with exactly 10p-10r-10a... he has also had 5 other ones with exactly 10r and 10a

FUN FACT: Jokic (11-11 FG on 10/20/18) had 1 of 3 triple-doubles in history without missing a FG (min. 10 FGAs) – Wilt Chamberlain had the other 2

FUN FACT: Since Jokic got his first triple-double on 2/3/17, the longest he has gone without getting one was 39 games from 4/2/17 to 1/8/18
