- Klineman is playing in her 21st AVP Tournament, with 5 wins (Austin, Manhattan Beach, Chicago and Honolulu all in 2018, Huntington Beach in 2019), 2 seconds, and 3 thirds
- Klineman is 5-2 in AVP championship matches (5-1 with April Ross, 0-1 with Lane Carico)
- Playing at New York for the 3rd straight year (did not make main draw in 2017 with Jace Pardon and finished 3rd with Ross last year).

April Ross - age 36 - 6'1" - hometown Newport Beach, Calif. - currently Costa Mesa, Calif. - Southern Cal

- Ross is playing in her 100th AVP tournament... she has won 34 times with 6 different partners... she also has 15 seconds and 21 thirds
- Ross is 34-15 in AVP championship matches (12-0 with Kerri Walsh Jennings, 12-13 with Jennifer Kessy, 5-1 with Alix Klineman, 2-0 with Lauren Fendrick, 2-0 with Jennifer Fopma, 1-0 with Whitney Pavlik, 0-1 with Caitlin Ledoux)... she had won 27 consecutive AVP title matches before losing in Seattle last year
- Ross has recorded at least two AVP titles in each of the last seven years and needs one victory to extend that streak to eight years... Won seven times in 2014... Has claimed 24 FIVB titles.

- Playing in her 17th career AVP tournament and her 5th New York event.
- Has 3 3rd-place finishes in New York (2015, 16 and 18) as well as a 7th (2017).
- This year she played at Huntington Beach with Brandie Wilkerson and recorded a 7th-place finish.
- Has reached three AVP championship matches, winning Chicago with Sara Hughes in 2017 and finishing second at San Francisco with Hughes in 2016 and second at Manhattan Beach with Brittany Hochevar in 2018.

Sarah Sponcil - age 22 - 5'10" - hometown Phoenix, Ariz. - currently Phoenix, Ariz. - Loyola Marymount / UCLA

- Playing in her 1st AVP event of 2019, her 7th career AVP tournament and 1st New York event.
- Played 5 AVP events last season, posting a 2nd at Austin with Lauren Fendrick and a 3rd at Chicago with Terese Cannon.

General AVP Championship Notes

- Only once in the past 19 AVP tournaments has a team seeded lower than 4th won a title (#12 Kelly Claes / Sara Hughes won in Chicago)
- While it did not happen at all in 2016 or 2017, last year there were two teams which won an AVP title in their first AVP event together... in Austin 2018 Alix Klineman / April Ross won in their AVP debut, then in New York City Summer Ross / Sara Hughes won when playing for the first time... this year Claes and Sponcil have a chance to replicate that feat
- In the previous 4 years in New York City, the women's champion has been seeded either #1 (twice) or #2 (twice)
- Starting with the 2016 season opener in New Orleans, just 2 of the 20 title matches on the women's side was an upset (the lower seeded team won), but now 3 of the last 5 AVP women's championships have been upsets
- In the last 7 AVP championships, 5 have required a third set to determine the winner... In 4 of those, the team losing the first set came back to win the title
