- Duo is playing together for the 9th time on the AVP and 21st time overall
- Duo has won four consecutive AVP events they have entered (did not play in last tournament in Austin) and has five AVP championships in eight previous events.
- They have finished top three in all eight of their previous AVP events (1st five times, 2nd once and 3rd two times).
- Team owns a 35-3 career match record and has won 20 consecutive AVP matches dating back to last year as the last team to beat them was Hughes / S. Ross in the Hermosa Beach finals in 2018. They have only lost 6 sets during the streak.
- Last time out on the AVP, they went 5-0 en route to the title, but were pushed to three sets in the semifinals (Sara Hughes/Summer Ross) and finals (Melissa Humana-Paredes/Sarah Pavan).
- Duo finished 3rd in New York last year,

April Ross – age 36 – 6’1” – hometown Newport Beach, Calif. – currently Costa Mesa, Calif. – USC

- Playing her 100th career AVP event and has 34 titles, 15 runner-up finishes and a total of 70 semifinal appearances.
- Will be playing New York for the 5th time and won in 2016 with Kerri Walsh Jennings and again in 2017 with Lauren Fendrick.
- Has recorded at least two AVP titles in each of the last seven years and needs one victory to extend that streak to eight years... Won seven times in 2014... Has claimed 24 FIVB titles.

Alex Klineman – age 29 – 6’5” – hometown Manhattan Beach, Calif. – currently Manhattan Beach, Calif. - Stanford

- Playing in her 21st career AVP event.
- Playing at New York for the 3rd straight year (did not make main draw in 2017 with Jace Pardon and finished 3rd with Ross last year).
- Klineman became the first woman to win a gold medal in her first international beach event when she and Ross teamed up to win an FIVB event in The Hague in January, 2018.
- Klineman’s 2018 AVP stat rankings included 3rd in hitting percentage (.491), 4th in aces (.96 per set) and 5th in blocks (1.09 per set).

Named AVP Rookie of the Year in 2017 (played with Jace Pardon, Branagan Fuller and Lane Carico).

- Playing their 6th AVP event and 20th overall.
- Duo is the defending champion of New York, defeating Nicole Branagh/Brandie Wilkerson in the finals.
- Placed 3rd at Huntington Beach this year with three of their five matches going three sets. They were 1-4 in 1st sets at Huntington Beach, losing the 1st set in each of their last four matches.
- Duo played four AVP events last year, reaching the final in every tournament (won New York and Hermosa Beach and were runners up in Chicago and Hawaii). In only event this year they reached the semifinal (Huntington Beach).
- The only team to defeat them in the AVP in 2018 was Alix Klineman and April Ross (1-3 record vs. Klineman/Ross). Duo was 16-0 against all other opponents in four tournaments on the year. This year team fell to Melissa Humana-Paredes/Sarah Pavan and Klineman/Ross at Huntington Beach (3-0 in other matches at Huntington).
- Last year team won its first 14 AVP matches before Klineman/Ross defeated them in the Chicago finals.

Sara Hughes – age 24 – 5'10" – hometown Costa Mesa, Calif. – currently Costa Mesa, Calif. – USC

- Playing in her 17th career AVP event and her 5th New York tournament.
- Hughes and then partner Kelly Claes became the lowest-seeded team (#16) to reach the semifinals of an AVP Tournament (New York City, 2015).
- Has won three AVP titles in her career (Chicago 2017, New York and Hermosa Beach 2018).
- Teamed with Kelly Claes to become the youngest team to ever win an AVP title (Chicago, 2017), when Hughes was 22 ½ and Claes was 21. They defeated Hughes' current partner Summer Ross (and Brooke Sweat) in the finals.

Summer Ross – age 26 – 6'1" – hometown San Diego, Calif. – currently Carlsbad, Calif. – Washington/Pepperdine

- Playing in her 39th career AVP event and 4th New York tournament.
- Has played in the championship match at New York in each of her previous three seasons with three different partners (2016 – Lane Carico – 2nd, 2017 – Brooke Sweat – 2nd, 2018 – Sara Hughes – 1st).
- Has reached the championship match in five of her last six AVP events (two titles) and in 10 of her last 14 AVP events (four titles). Has five career AVP titles.
- Led the AVP in blocks (1.27 per set) and kills (9.34 per set), while ranking 2nd in hitting percentage (.510) in 2018.

Kelley Larsen – age 26 – 6'2" – hometown San Diego, Calif. – currently Redondo Beach, Calif. – Pepperdine

- Playing in her 25th career AVP tournament and 4th New York event.
- Best New York finishes were 5th in each of the last two years.
- Has two career AVP wins (2015 Cincinnati Open and 2017 San Francisco, both with Betsi Flint).
- Reached five AVP championship matches with Flint during their pairing (two wins, three seconds).
- Ranked 4th in blocks (1.13 per set) and 5th in hitting percentage (.476) on the AVP last year.

Emily Stockman – age 30 – 6'0" – hometown Colo. Springs, Colo. – currently Hermosa Beach, Calif. – Wichita State

- Playing in her 35th career AVP event and 5th New York tournament.
