Terese Cannon / Megan Kraft (Brooklyn Blaze) vs. Betsi Flint / Julia Scoles (L.A. Launch)

- Technically Cannon / Kraft lead the series 2-0 but they have actually only played one time, in the 2024 Heritage Series finale in Chicago... in that match Flint / Scoles won an extended first set 25-23 but then Cannon / Kraft rebounded to win the last two sets

- The duo finished 5th in all three Heritage Series events this year
- The two players were raised and live in cities about as far apart as possible in the continental U.S. (Cannon in Pittsford, N.Y. and Kraft in San Diego)... although they didn't overlap they do have playing at Southern Cal as a common denominator... Cannon played 2016-2019 at USC while Kraft played 2021-2023
- Both players are twins... Cannon has a twin sister (Maryn) while Kraft has a twin brother (Brian)
- In 1 season as partners on the AVP, they are 6-6 (50%) in matches, 3-2 (60%) when winning the first set, 3-4 (42.9%) when losing the first set, and 4-4 (50%) in three-set matches
- Cannon has 1 win (Hermosa Beach in 2022 with Sarah Sponcil), 1 second (Atlanta 2022 with Sponcil) and 9 thirds
- Cannon was the 2022 AVP Most Improved Player
- Kraft's best finishes have been a pair of 3rd-places, both with Emily Stockman (in the 2022 season opener in New Orleans and in Manhattan Beach 2023)
- In Huntington Beach 2019 Kraft and Delaynie Maple became the youngest team to ever advance from the qualifier on the AVP Tour... the high school teammates (and later college teammates) were both 16 years old... the duo beat three tandems of sisters, including two sets of twins, and placed 13th
- Cannon / Kraft had a 6-0 run in the second set against Kelly Cheng / Sara Hughes (Nitro) to take a 12-11 lead in week 1 but lost that set 16-14
- Cannon had 3 blocks in each of her first two League matches
- Kraft is tied with two others (Hailey Harward and Sara Hughes) for the lead in digs per set at 5.00... she averaged 5.17 in the Heritage Series this season

Flint / Scoles have played 8 AVP events together since 2023

- They have 1 win (in Manhattan Beach 2023), three 2nds and three 3rds on the AVP... their 7th place finish in the 2024 season finale in Chicago was their only event not advancing to the semifinals
- In their AVP debut (2023 season opener in Miami), the pair advanced to the championship match with their only 2 match losses coming to the #1 and #2 seeds in the event
- In Manhattan Beach 2023 they became the first team to ever be seeded #1 and lose to a #32 seed, but then they fought back through the contender's bracket to win the title, winning 8 straight matches
- In 2 seasons as partners on the AVP, they are 34-13 (72.3%) in matches, 24-4 (85.7%) when winning the first set, 8-8 (50%) when losing the first set, and 15-7 (68.2%) in three-set matches
- Flint has 7 AVP wins with 4 different partners in 6 different seasons, and she has won with each of her partners that she has played more than 1 tournament with... her wins came in Mason 2015 (with Kelley Kolinske), San Francisco 2017 (with Kolinske), Seattle 2018 (with Emily Capers), San Francisco 2018 (with Capers), Hermosa Beach 2019 (with Capers), New Orleans 2022 (with Kelly Cheng) and Manhattan Beach 2023 (with Julia Scoles)
- Flint was the AVP Newcomer of the Year in 2015 and is a three-time Best Server (2019, 2022, 2023)
- Scoles has 2 wins (Atlanta 2022 with Geena Urango and Manhattan Beach 2023 with Betsi Flint) and 5 seconds
- Scoles was the 2022 AVP Rookie of the Year and the 2023 Most Improved Player of the Year
- Since the start of the 2022 season, she has been eliminated from 13 AVP events and 11 times the other team had an Olympian on it
- Flint / Scoles won the league opening match after fighting off 2 match points in the second set against Toni Rodriguez / Geena Urango (Smash)
- Flint ranks 16th in hitting percentage (.315)... in the Heritage Series she had the most aces (35) of any female player in 2024
- Scoles ranks 5th in the League in both blocks per set (.60) and hitting percentage (.467)

Cody Caldwell / Seain Cook (Brooklyn Blaze) vs Tim Bomgren / Troy Field (L.A. Launch)

- The two teams have met just once, earlier this summer on the Contender Series in Waupaca... Bomgren / Field won a tight match in the semifinals 22-20, 21-19

- The duo won in Waupaca 2023 in their debut (on the Tour Series) and also closed the 2023 season with another victory in Laguna Beach (also on the Tour Series)... they have 2 second-place finishes (Huntington Beach 2024 and Virginia Beach 2024 on the Contender Series)
- In 2 seasons as partners on the AVP, they are 36-13 (73.5%) in matches, 32-2 (94.1%) when winning the first set, 4-11 (26.7%) when losing the first set, and 11-4 (73.3%) in three-set matches
- Caldwell / Cook are 1 of just 2 teams to play in all 6 AVP tournaments this season (along with Ryan Ierna / Diego Perez)
- Caldwell has 3 Tour Series wins in his career and his 2 second-place finishes both came this season
- Cook has 2 Tour Series wins in his career and his 2 second-place finishes both came this season... all 4 of those title match appearances came alongside Caldwell
- The duo started its first 2 league sets strong but couldn't finish (led 8-6 in first set against Taylor Crabb / Taylor Sander but lost 15-10, then was tied 5-5 in second set but lost 15-11)
- Caldwell had a solid match in his last outing against the Smash (Chase Budinger / Miles Evans), as he hit .643 (14 attacks, 10 kills, 1 error), and had 3 blocks and 2 aces
- Cook ranks 4th in the League in digs per set (2.75)... his hitting percentage in the League (.444) is almost identical to what he had on the Heritage Series (.447)

Bomgren / Field have played 15 AVP events together since 2019 (played in 2019-2020, then not until 2024)

- They have a best finish of 2nd place, done twice... they placed 2nd in New York City 2019 despite losing their first match of the tournament (then winning 5 straight elimination matches in sweeps before dropping the title match) and then again in Waupaca 2024 on the Contender Series
- The duo reunited this season as they were partners in 2019 and 2020 before going their separate ways... their partnership began in Huntington Beach 2019 and in their first match together they defeated a pair of Olympians, Sean Rosenthal and Ricardo Santos
- In 3 seasons as partners on the AVP, they are 43-26 (62.3%) in matches, 32-3 (91.4%) when winning the first set, 11-23 (32.4%) when losing the first set, and 16-7 (69.6%) in three-set matches
- Bomgren has 1 win (Virginia Beach 2022 on the Tour Series with Piotr Marciniak), 3 seconds and 4 thirds... after reaching the semifinals in New York in 2019, he then played in 17 tournaments with a best of 5th place 4 times before winning in Virginia Beach 2022 on the Tour Series
- Field has had a best of 2nd place 4 times on the AVP Tour with 3 different partners (in New York 2019 with Tim Bomgren, in Austin 2022 with Chase Budinger, in New Orleans 2023 with Billy Allen and in Waupaca 2024 on the Contender Series with Bomgren)
- The Launch men have lost both of their League matches in three sets, and both times the duo won the first set and then lost the next two sets
- In Austin 2018 Bomgren played for the title (alongside Taylor Crabb), marking his first ever AVP championship match (but he lost to Dalhausser)
- Bomgren enters week 4 ranking 2nd in digs per set (2.83)... he has 1 of just 4 men's matches in League play (through the first 3 weeks) with at least 10 digs (others done by Taylor Crabb, Miles Evans and Miles Partain)
- Field is 3rd in the League in blocks per set (1.00)... he has had at least 1 block in 5 of his first 6 sets played in the League

Billy Allen / Paul Lotman (Austin Aces) vs Phil Dalhausser / Avery Drost (Palm Beach Passion)

- These two teams have never played before but the individuals have history against each other on the court
 - Allen and Dalhausser have played each other 20 times between 2009 and 2023... Dalhausser leads the series 16-4 after winning 10 of the first 11 meetings... 3 of Allen's wins have come in three-set matches... the two players met in the semifinals once, and it happened to come right here in Austin in 2017 (Dalhausser / Nick Lucena defeated Allen / Stafford Slick 21-17, 21-16)
 - Allen leads the series against Drost 13-4, but Drost has won 2 of the last 3 meetings (all in 2023)... they first played each other in 2011 and 13 of the 17 matches took place in 2011-2017... in the first 13 meetings 12 were sweeps, but then there has been just 1 sweep in the last 4 matches
 - Lotman and Dalhausser have played against each other 9 times and Dalhausser holds a slim 5-4 edge... Dalhausser has won 3 of the last 4 times in the series
 - Lotman and Drost have played 3 times, with the matches taking place in 2022 and 2023... Lotman won the first two, then Drost won the last meeting in Hermosa Beach 2023... all 3 meetings have been sweeps

- The two players are a combined 80 years old
- In 1 season as partners on the AVP, they are 8-6 (57.1%) in matches, 6-0 (100%) when winning the first set, 2-6 (25%) when losing the first set, and 5-0 (100%) in three-set matches
- Allen has 2 wins (in Seattle 2016 with Theo Brunner and in Seattle 2017 with Stafford Slick) plus one Tour Series win (in Denver 2023 with Alison Cerutti), 5 seconds and 12 thirds
- Since the start of the 2023 season, Allen has teamed with 3 different Olympians (Andy Benesh, Alison Cerutti and Paul Lotman)
- When Allen played his first ever pro beach event, Miles Partain was just 2 ½ years old
- Lotman has 1 win (Atlanta 2022 with Miles Partain)... in that event he had three-set wins over the #3 seed (twice) as well as the #1 seed (in the championship match)
- Lotman has played in a total of 7 semifinals, and all 7 came alongside Miles Partain... he has placed 2nd once (in Phoenix 2022)
- Entering week 4 Allen ranks 14th in hitting percentage (.321) and Lotman is 16th (.188)
- Allen has yet to have a service error or a service ace
- Lotman leads all men's players with 1.50 aces per set

- The duo made their debut in Huntington Beach 2023... they finished 5th in each of their first 4 AVP events before placing 3rd in the 2023 season finale in Chicago... then this year they two 7ths and a 5th
- In 2 seasons as partners on the AVP, they are 22-16 (57.9%) in matches, 21-2 (91.3%) when winning the first set, 1-14 (6.7%) when losing the first set, and 6-4 (60%) in three-set matches
- This season they have a 7-6 match record entering Chicago... they are 7-0 when winning the first set and 0-6 when losing the first set... they have scored 541 points compared to giving up 537 points
- In their first 2 tournaments they played 10 matches and 6 went to a third set... in their last 6 tournaments they played 28 matches and just 4 three-set matches
- Dalhausser has won 62 AVP titles (plus 38 FIVB wins and 1 NVL victory)... he has 21 seconds, 26 thirds and 1 fourth... he has been in the semifinals in 110 of his 163 completed AVP tournaments (67%)
- The 62 AVP wins ranks 5th all time (behind Karch Kiraly, Kent Steffes, Randy Skolos and Sinjin Smith)
- Drost marks the 13th different partner that Dalhausser has ever had... 5 of them have been new partners for him since the start of 2022... Drost now ranks as the 4th-most frequent partner for Dalhausser
- Since winning in Austin in 2005, Dalhausser won at least one title (AVP or FIVB) in 16 straight seasons before 2021
- Drost has advanced to 9 semifinals in his AVP career, including 3 second-place finishes with Chase Frishman on the Tour Series in 2022... they made it to the title match in Atlantic City, Virginia Beach and Huntington Beach (where their only two losses were to top seeds Taylor Crabb / Taylor Sander)
- Drost has played with 32 different partners, including 6 different Olympians (indoors and beach)... Dalhausser is just the 2nd person he has ever partnered with for at least 6 events (also Chase Frishman, 18)... 2013 was the only season he ever played with just one partner
- In the League the Passion have only scored in double digits once out of 4 sets played entering week 4
- Dalhausser has played well when the AVP had Tour stops in Austin... he had his first ever win here in 2005, and also won in 2017, 2018 and 2022 (the last time the AVP played here)... in total he played 6 AVP events in Austin... in his first one (in 2004) he had a 2-2 match record... since then he has won 25 of 27 matches here
- Dalhausser has had just 8 attacks in his first 4 sets played
- Drost averaged 4.39 digs per set on the AVP Tour this summer (5th best among players with 10+ matches played), but has had just 4 digs total in his first 4 sets played in the League

Taryn Kloth / Kristen Nuss (Austin Aces) vs Melissa Humana-Paredes / Brandie Wilkerson (Palm Beach Passion)

- Kloth / Nuss lead the series 8-6 but Humana-Paredes / Wilkerson won the last 3 meetings... the two teams have met in some big matches, including in 5 AVP finals (Kloth / Nuss won 3 times) and in the 2024 Paris Olympics (Humana-Paredes / Wilkerson won)... 8 of the 14 meetings have gone to a third set (Humana-Paredes / Wilkerson have won 5 of those 8 matches)

- The duo has won 7 AVP titles (in their debut as a team in Atlanta 2021, Austin 2022, Chicago 2022, Phoenix 2022, Atlanta 2023, Chicago 2023 and Manhattan Beach 2024)
- On the AVP Tour the duo has won 24 of their last 27 AVP matches over the past 4 tournaments
- In 4 seasons as partners on the AVP (including qualifiers), they are 72-19 (79.1%) in matches, 59-5 (92.2%) when winning the first set, 11-11 (50%) when losing the first set, 0-2 in one-set matches and 23-9 (71.9%) in three-set matches
- In their AVP careers, 15 of their 19 match losses have come against teams with at least one beach Olympian
- Kloth and Nuss both played for LSU beach volleyball in 2019, 2020 and 2021... Kloth and Nuss were teammates on court 1 in 2021, finishing the season 36-0
- This year they have played for the title in 6 of the last 7 tournaments (AVP and international), with the exception being the 9th-place finish in the Olympics
- Kloth and Nuss were the AVP Team of the Year in both 2022 and 2023
- Kloth has played all 17 AVP events and all 27 World Beach Pro Tour events alongside Nuss
- Kloth won her first ever pro beach volleyball tournament that she played... outside of the early days of the AVP, no other player has ever won an AVP title when making their beach volleyball debut (in Glendale 2009 Julianna Felisberta / Larissa Maestrini won when both players were making the AVP debuts but were already one of the top teams in the world)
- And for another first, Kloth played indoors at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska, and is the first player known to go to Creighton in the bvbinfo.net database of 23,000 players (which also includes international players)
- Kloth went 50-0 in matches her last two seasons of beach volleyball at LSU
- Nuss played 5 events with 3 other partners before teaming with Kloth and was 0-4 in main draw matches in those AVP tournaments... in 4 of her first 5 AVP tournaments, Nuss was eliminated in a three-set match
- All 4 of Nuss' career partners on the AVP Tour were teammates of hers at LSU
- In the League Kloth ranks 1st in hitting percentage (.727), 1st in aces (1.50 per set) and 2nd in kills per set (6.25)
- Kloth committed a hitting error in her first League match, but none since then... her hitting percentage by sets in League play: .600, .769, .750, .833
- Nuss ranks 4th in the League in hitting percentage (.471), a big improvement over her Heritage Series season total of .376 this year

Humana-Paredes / Wilkerson have played 8 AVP events together since 2022

- The duo has advanced to the finals 7 of their first 8 AVP tournaments together... they have 3 wins (Miami in the 2023 season opener, Huntington Beach in the 2024 season opener and in Chicago 2024)... they were the only team (men or women) to win 2 of the 2024 Heritage Series events which came with an automatic berth into the League

- In 3 seasons as partners on the AVP, they are 34-11 (75.6%) in matches, 30-3 (90.9%) when winning the first set, 4-8 (33.3%) when losing the first set, and 11-5 (68.8%) in three-set matches
- Humana-Paredes has 5 AVP wins... she won 2 times with Sarah Pavan (Manhattan Beach 2019 and Honolulu 2019) and 3 times with Brandie Wilkerson (the 2023 season opener in Miami, the 2024 season opener in Huntington Beach, and the 2024 season finale in Chicago)
- Humana-Paredes has advanced to the semifinals in 14 of her 18 completed AVP events (78%) and to the championship match 12 times (67%)
- Humana-Paredes won 2 AVP awards, both in 2019 (Best Defensive Player and Newcomer of the Year)
- Humana-Paredes has played in 90 FIVB / Volleyball World Beach Pro tournaments (9 golds, 10 silvers, 3 bronzes and 7 fourths)... all of her medals came with Sarah Pavan before getting her first with Brandie Wilkerson in June 2023... she is a two-time Olympian who won the Silver Medal in Paris 2024
- Wilkerson has 3 AVP titles, all with Humana-Paredes (the 2023 season opener in Miami, the 2024 season opener in Huntington Beach, and the 2024 season finale in Chicago)
- On the AVP Tour Wilkerson has played with 7 different partners, 5 of whom have been Olympians
- In total she has been in the semifinals 15 times in her 27 AVP tournaments... she has reached the semis with 4 different partners and the title match with 3 different ones
- Wilkerson is a two-time Olympian who won the Silver Medal in Paris 2024
- Wilkerson has twice been named the AVP's Best Blocker (in 2022 and 2023)
- In week 2 of the League the duo recorded the biggest win (margin-wise) to this point in either men's or women's play with a 15-5 win over the Dream (Kylie Deberg / Hailey Harward)
- As Humana-Paredes goes, so goes the Passion; in their first match Humana-Paredes had 4 kills, 1 ace and hit .250 and the Passion lost... in their second match she had 8 kills, 3 aces and hit .636 and the Passion won
- Wilkerson is leading the League in blocks (1.75 per set)... she led the Heritage Series too (1.59 per set)
